"This gift means that low-income families are able to receive financial assistance to ensure their children thrive in the after-school care they need."

The Family Y is now an association of eight branches, two program centers, a licensed childcare centers, 31 school-based after-school programs and Camp Lakeside, an 88-acre lakefront camp property.

At the Y, no one is turned away for inability to pay. The Family Y provided over \$826,000 in 2010 in financial assistance for all YMCA programs and services to children, adults and families in need.

Their mission is to serve individuals and families in the CSRA through programs designed to build healthy spirit, mind and body, reflecting the values of the Judeo-Christian tradition while maintaining respect for all people.
